The members of TAPS are completing their 19th year of well measuring, data collection and record keeping at the end of 2025. We have a core number of original members who have been part of the program since 2006 and a handful of others who kindly share their data with us.

In 2024, Dan Ruimy (Mayor) assured a resident that there wouldn't be development on Thornhill. As we are nearing the end of 2025, this Council has focussed on industrial development on 256th and urban density development is centred around the town core. Zoning can always change depending on the focus of Councils, so TAPS will always remain vigilant and stay the course.

The wells in the program have remained consistent even though our summers are longer and drier. We encourage all well owners to take care of their wells and keep consistent records that you can rely on and reflect on when changes occur.

Thornhill is a very special community in Maple Ridge. With our consistent care and diligence, it will remain a special rural part of Maple Ridge. We feel grateful for the opportunity to live here.

Many left the contest talking about how they want to participate next year.



After a busy and creative summer of dyeing and spinning, the members of the Whonnock Weavers and Spinners are happy to get back to their looms and prepare for our 44th Annual Juried Exhibit and Sale. This event is always the last Sunday in November, and this year the date is Sunday, November 30 from 10 AM to 4PM at Whonnock Lake Centre. We anticipate welcoming you there, where you will find an assortment of fibre articles – woven scarves, tea towels and jackets, knitted hats, baskets and many more items. We also tempt you with coffee, tea and homemade cookies. As well, a few guest artists will complement the fibre with pottery, woodwork and ironwork. As in past years, we hope to see many of you there.



Much of our summer was spent preparing for our exhibit at Country Fest. We dyed local fleeces in bright colours that appealed to the many children who visited us in the curling rink. There they were helped to blend the colours using a drum carder, then took their colourful "stash" to a spinner who helped them to spin a bracelet which was promptly tied around their wrist.

Other children chose to weave a mug rug with the help of one of our weavers. These were distributed to the young weavers in September after a group of our members finished the ends. We had well over 200 children and parents visit with us over the two days of Country Fest. If you have never attended this wonderful community event, we hope to see you there next July.

We are a vibrant and growing group of fibre artists, and welcome anyone with the same "addiction". We meet on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month at 6:30 PM at St. John the Divine Church at the corner of Laity and River Road in Maple Ridge, a location that accommodates many of our members who live in places like Surrey, New Westminster, and even Osoyoos.
