

OBITUARY



Fred Braches

8 October 1930 – 1 February 2024

Fred was born in Indonesia, went to school and business college in the Netherlands, and then worked in international shipping. In the 1960s, he was the representative of a Dutch shipping line on the west coast of South America, living first in Colombia, then in Chile, then in Peru. It was in South America that he met his wife, Helmi. After two years in Hong Kong, at that time the head office of Fred's company, he and Helmi immigrated to Canada. In 1985, they moved to Whonnock – and what a change that was! It took some years to become “acclimatized,” but by 1995, when Fred retired from his work, he had absorbed enough of the local spirit from Brian Byrnes to plunge right into local history. His starting point was the result of a history project sponsored by the Whonnock Community Association.

Fred's way of doing history was research, research, research, and his aim was to establish the truth. When he felt he had exhausted a topic, he published his findings in his *Whonnock Notes*, a series of occasional papers, which are all available on the Internet. For quite a number of years he produced calendars with historical photographs. He also wrote articles in the Looking Back column in the Maple Ridge–Pitt Meadows News, which he later published in a small volume.

At some point Fred got side-tracked by the legend of Slumach and the Pitt Lake gold. Here as well, he wanted to find out the truth, and he came to the conclusion that the connection of this old Indian with gold was a hoax, created by the press years after his death. Fred's take on the story was published by Heritage House as *In Search of Pitt Lake Gold*.

The work on Slumach put Fred in connection with a number of gold dreamers and eventually landed him on the TV reality show *The Curse of the Frozen Gold*, released in 2015. Another TV show followed, *Deadman's Curse*, of which the third episode is being shot now. Working with the TV people was a completely new experience for Fred, which he much enjoyed.

Fred loved life in Whonnock. His interest in local history brought him into contact with many people. He will be remembered by many, and his work will live on.

The Whonnock Community Association would like to celebrate the life of Fred Braches, as we say goodbye to a good friend, we are forever grateful for all your hard work and dedication to our community. It was an honour to know you and to work together with you.

TAPS (Thornhill Aquifer Protection Study)

The Thornhill Aquifer Protection Study is entering its 18th year of water monitoring on the Grant Hill Aquifer. We have appreciated all the members that have continued to have their wells monitored during this time.


All the residents who are dependent on the aquifer for clean drinking water and for agricultural purposes have been integral to the study and protection of this important bedrock aquifer.

This past Fall we met with the Environment Minister George Heyman and MLA Bob D'Eith in our steadfast goal to have our Provincial Government protect the Crown Lands that house part of our aquifer. They asked to meet with Klaus and I. We walked them through the trails in the Crown Land and had some very frank discussions regarding our request. It takes a lot of time and perseverance, but we have always been up for the challenge. We will keep you posted. Throughout our very dry season, even as many shallow wells suffered, the drilled wells made it through without much change. Thankfully. We are expecting another dry summer season and wildfires are expected to be even more of a problem.

This Fall, we traveled throughout the Okanagan concentrating on the North Shuswap. After seeing first hand the wildfire devastation and learning from many residents who fought the fires, the experience had a sobering impact on how real the threat is.

The need for more awareness, education and employing sound wildfire prevention practices by residents is becoming obvious. We need to protect our forests as without them, we will have no water.

Water conservation and due diligence are key.

It was a beautiful day, the hall was filled with an abundance of handwoven, handknitted and handspun articles, as well as articles from a select group of guest artists. Once again, it was a successful day, and we send a heartfelt thanks to all who attended, and especially to those who purchased our handmade articles. We are already in the early stages of planning for our 43rd edition of this popular day. We would like to thank all Whonnockians who attended and hopefully enjoyed themselves. 


