



The Death of Bud Hjorleifson

Bud Hjorleifson, long-time pillar of the Anglican Church in Whonnock, died suddenly on September 18. His services to the church will be greatly missed. His hard work keeping the church grounds beautiful was enjoyed by anyone driving on 272nd.

A retired detective who believed in rehabilitation of those he once apprehended, he was a dedicated civilian escort for prisoners on outings to the church to help prepare them to reintegrate into the community once released.




