

TAPS (Thornhill Aquifer Protection Study)



2025 marks the 19th year that TAPS has been keeping records on the wells both deep and shallow on the Grant Hill Aquifer on Thornhill.

Fortunately, development whether it is urban housing or light industrial has not yet taken place. We cannot stress enough that you should all be measuring your well depths quarterly, so that you have a record of your well's behaviour consistently through the seasons. If your well is impacted suddenly or you are losing water quantity or the well water becomes contaminated, it will be very difficult to prove the source.

* We received an email from Sunny Schiller (Councillor) that the City will be reviewing the OCP in the next weeks to determine the changes that Council would like to make. The OCP has not been reviewed since 2006. The Province is mandating a review every 5 years.

We have specifically addressed the issues around Urban Forestry as this will impact our watershed greatly. Please keep informed and write Mayor, Council and Scott Hartman CEO with your concerns. (mayorandcouncil@mapleridge.ca) and (shartman@mapleridge.ca). It is your opportunity to be heard.

The well water levels and chemical analysis continue to be consistent. Even as climate change is upon us, the wells have not shown any significant changes as yet.



In it, the author recounts his life in northern Manitoba from birth (on a snowbank!) to age fifteen. In the words of one reviewer, it "is a stirring, powerful account of finding joy on the upper side of hardship and beauty in both darkness and light. Recounted in musical English prose inflected with Cree words and concepts, it's a vision of a vanished world and a keen insight into one of Canada's most important writers." I loved the book, and I know of several others who did as well.

KAYAK/CANOE PADDLING SPRING CAMP

Age: 8-14Y

Learn kayak and canoe paddling in a fun and safe environment on Whonnock Lake. Learn basic skills of water safety, posture, stroke technique, coordination and balance in recreational kayaks and canoes. A variety of outdoor games and activities are included in the camp. Participants are briefly introduced to racing kayaks and canoes. Ridge Canoe and Kayak Club provides adaptive equipment to aid participants of all abilities to experience paddling.

HATHA YOGA

Age: 16Y+

This alignment-oriented class emphasizes posture and breath. It uses poses and stretches in combination with the breath that will develop and increase flexibility and relaxation. An excellent way to calm the mind and connect with your body. Please bring your own mat.

RCKC'S PADDLING PALS

Age: 8-12Y

The Ridge Canoe and Kayak paddling pals is an after-school paddling program that introduces children to the sport of sprint canoe/kayak in a fun, safe and team-oriented environment. The program is run by our Canoekids certified coaches. We focus on teaching the FUNdamentals of paddling by developing a foundation for movement skills, coordination, balance and teamwork. Promoting outdoor activity; our multi-sport/ activity-based program will help keep the children engaged, active and having fun, with plenty of

time for free play and socialization. Not to mention developing a new set of paddling skill.

LEARN TO PADDLE

Age: 8-14Y

Learn proper posture, balance, steering, stroke technique and basic water safety skills in both kayaks and canoes at Whonnock Lake. Instruction given by Ridge Canoe and Kayak Club coaches and all equipment is included.

ADULT LEARN TO KAYAK

Age: 19Y +





